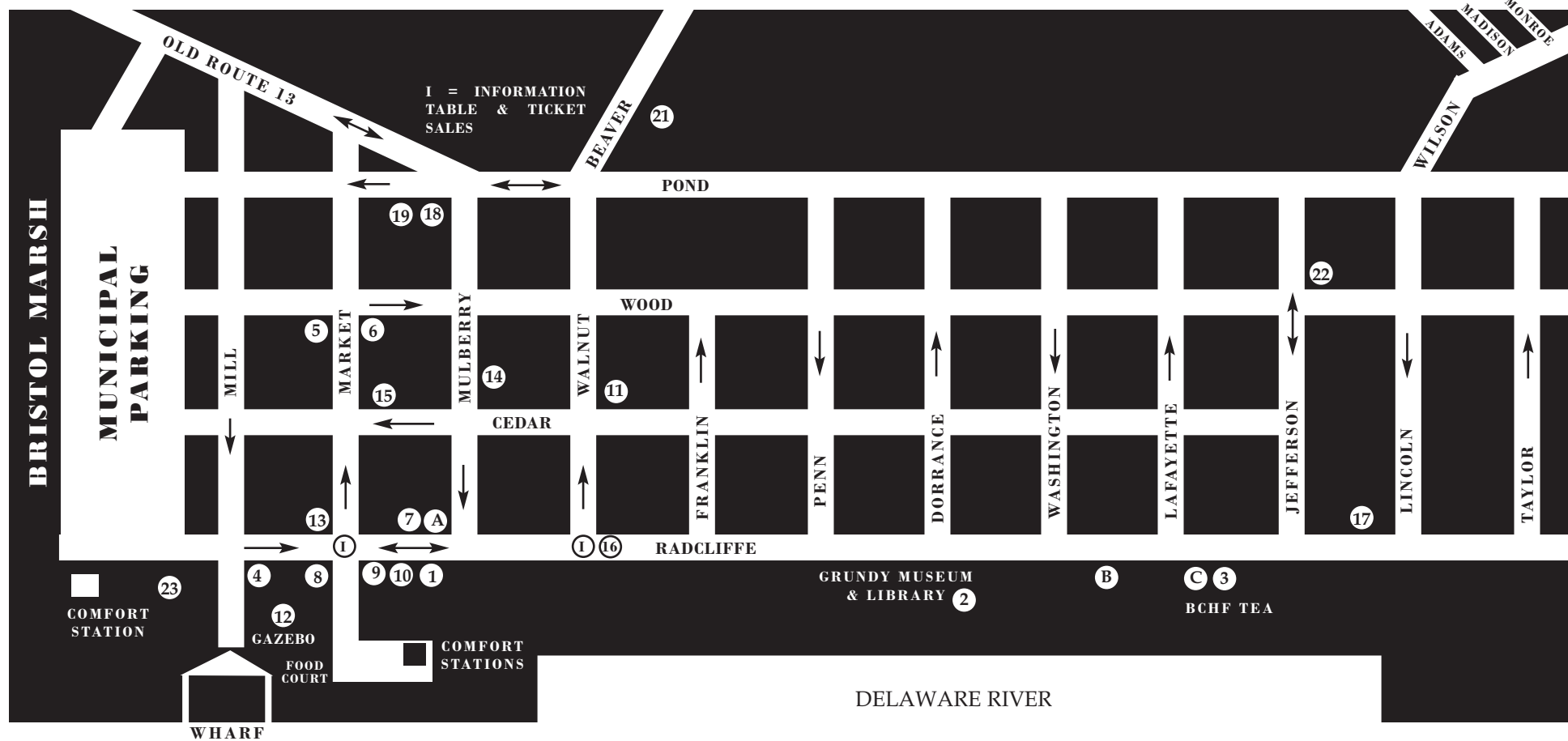

HISTORIC HOUSE TOUR AND TEA . . . TICKET REQUIRED

One of the outstanding events of each Historic Bristol Day is the Historic House Tour and Tea featuring visits to some of the town's most unique examples of period architecture. The locations are indicated on the map and listed below, are included on the tour and, as an added bonus, ticket holders are invited to tea and pastries at 922 Radcliffe Street overlooking the Delaware River. Tickets are available at the Information Tables (1 on map)

If you wish to attend the tea only, there is a nominal fee of \$2.00 payable to the hostess at the Tea.

- A. 251 Radcliffe Street** - Residence of Jesse Graves; owned by Gerald Kline. Built between 1894 and 1903 as an office. First listed as a private residence in 1949. This is a narrow "infill" house located between older residences.. Notice the elliptical windows.
- B. 800 Radcliffe Street** - Home of Louis and Cissi Quattrocchi. Built in 1821 in a Colonial Revival style.
- C. 910 Radcliffe Street** - Home of Adele Shea. 1765 Georgian house; believed to be the oldest house in present-day Bristol. Recently underwent extensive renovation.

Bristol Borough was recently selected as one of the "Classic Towns" of Greater Philadelphia by the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission. Founded in 1681, the borough is one of the oldest towns in Bucks County and in the State of Pennsylvania. It is situated on the banks of the Delaware River at the southern terminus of the Delaware Canal. Several of its neighborhoods, including the "Old Town" section, are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Bristol was featured in the August 1989 issue of Colonial Homes

Walking Tours - Always A Hit

This year there are 3 walking tours scheduled. At 11 am the tour starts at the Bristol Riverside Theatre and will stroll along Radcliffe St. looking at some of the most historical buildings in town. At 1 pm the "Old Towne" tours starts at the Coca Cola sign on Radcliffe & Market Sts. NEW this year is a tour featuring the Thomas Cooper & Robert Tyler families starting at the Grundy Library at 3 pm. Cooper was a famous Shakespearean actor who constructed a home here in 1821. His daughter married Robert Tyler, son of President John Tyler and the young couple lived here after they resided in the White House. The graves of Thomas & Mary Cooper will also be visited.
